Reports:

a. Principal's Report: Deborah Luporini. See principal's report for June 2021.

- Enrolment is up to 352
- It is Bike to School Week. It's going very well with lots of kids biking and walking.
- The Grade 7 leaving ceremony will be on June 23. No parents will be allowed but it will be filmed and given to parents on a flash drive.
- Yearbooks have arrived.
- Last day of school is June 24. (June 25 is an admin day.)

Discussion of tree removal at GES

Principal Luporini provided a summary of what she has been told about the tree removal. A branch fell off a tree. This is considered evidence of 'tree failure' overall. If there is no time to get an arborist's report the tree can be removed. Topping is considered a poor practice. She expects other trees currently slated for removal will be subject to much more thorough scrutiny in terms of why they need to be removed.

Further discussion from PAC members: All of this could have been avoided. We would like assurances from the school district no more trees will be removed without prior discussion. We believe an independent arborist's report should be done on the GES trees by someone who is not going to profit from having them removed.

Motion: Martial will request a meeting with the school district and the town of Gibsons regarding the tree cutting, hopefully before the end of the year. Barry Janyk first, Emily Doyle second. None opposed.

Deborah Luporini thanked the PAC members for their work on behalf of the students.

b. Treasurer's report: Debbie Small. Please see Treasurer's report for June 2021

- We have to return any money not spent on VisionZero safe routes to schools project if it's not spent.
- We spent about \$1,000 on Sports Day food.

- Trustees have wrapped up virtual school tours
- Pam gave a speech for virtual grad at Elphi.
- The board has hired a new superintendent. Decision will be announced soon.

d. DPAC report: Lorena Ruth

- Langdale PAC had an RCMP officer come and speak about safety who was reportedly very good with the kids. She has info in case we want to do that next year.
- Cedar Grove is doing an 'envelope campaign' for PAC this year as an alternative to fundraising.
- Two speakers have been chosen for the fall for parent education.
