Huge success. Lessons: positive experience for parents to connect with staff and school community, pre-ordering on the hot lunch program so we have an idea of numbers (planned for 200 and kept needing to go out to get more), having a volunteer to take care of the teachers to ensure they get fed – food brought to them, tables set up very well done, maybe pre-cook burgers, put the hot lunch sign up in the waiting area, juice boxes ran out, invest in hot dog machine spinner, no burgers just hot dogs – buy way to many that's okay because they stack and freeze well. Line-ups great to make connections, but faster produced food would be great. Couple of condiment stations. Space where people can congregate, and somewhere people can sit – the Amphitheatre in back was suggested. More grill space if doing burgers again. Having veggie stuff really separate in the kitchen made it awkward – make it more inclusive, have a separate station closer by.
